The Mankota & District Fire Department Inter-Municipal Fire Rates Bylaw - Bylaw 02/11

1. Rates for equipment and manpower responding to an incident within the Mankota & District Fire Department encompassing the rural municipalities of Mankota No. 45, Glen McPherson No. 46 and The Village of Mankota.

(note - this does not include lands within the Grasslands National Park or adjoining municipality's to whom we respond and receive assistance on a reciprocal basis)

- i. \$250.00 per hour for Pumper 63
- ii. \$200.00 per hour for Pumper 64
- iii. \$125.00 per hour for quick attack F150 fire units
- iv. Actual cash value of lost or destroyed equipment
- v. Resources obtained from outside the municipality or contracted agencies based on actual invoiced costs.
- 2. For fire service responses located on residential or agriculturally zoned land within the fire district for a fire not intentionally set by the occupant, or to fires caused by an act of nature or vandalism, charges will be actual costs as set out in paragraph 1, to a maximum of \$1,500.00.
- For fire service responses within the "fire district" or on "fire district" roads to an emergency caused by or an act of nature or action or failure to act by another person, charges will be actual costs as set out in paragraph 1, to a maximum of \$1,500.00.
- 4. Where fire services costs are to a result of an intentional act, or simple negligence of the person or persons requiring assistance Council may, at its discretion charge the person or persons the full fire department costs at the rates outlined in paragraph 1.
- 5. Where the Mankota & District Fire Department has taken action whatsoever for the purpose of responding to an Incident within the "fire district" including any such action taken on a false alarm Council may, in respect of any costs incurred by the "fire district" in taking such action charge any costs so incurred to the person who caused the fire or the owner or occupant of the land or property in respect of which such action was taken.
