

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MANKOTA NO. 45  
BYLAW NO. 02/88

A bylaw of the Rural Municipality of Mankota No. 45 to designate the property known as the McCord Museum at McCord, Saskatchewan as being a site of architectural and historical value.

Whereas part 111 of the Heritage Property Act authorizes the Council of a Municipality to enact bylaws to designate real property, including all buildings and structures thereon, to be of architectural, historical or natural value or interest; and

Whereas the Council of the Corporation of the Rural Municipality of Mankota No. 45 has caused to be served on the owners of the lands and premises known as the McCord Museum at Railway Avenue a Notice of Intention to be published in at least two issues of a Newspaper with general circulation in the Municipality with the first publication at least twenty-one (21) days prior to the date of consideration of the bylaw and with the last publication at least seven (7) days prior to the date of that consideration ; and

Whereas no Notice of Objection to the proposed designation has been served on the Adminsitrator of the Municipality;

Therefore, the Council of the Corporation of the Rural Municipality of Mankota No. 45 enacts as follows

1. There is designated as being of architectural and historical value or interest the real property known as the McCord Museum at Railway Avenue in the Hamlet of McCord and legally described as:

all that portion of the South West Quarter of Section THIRTY SIX (36) in Township FIVE (5), in Range SEVEN (7), West of the Third Meridian in the Province of Saskatchewan, in the Dominion of Canada, taken for station grounds of the Canadian Pacific Railway, according to a plan of record in the Land Titles Office for the Swift Current Land Registration District as No. BV 4667, lying to the North East of a line drawn parallel with and perpendicularly distant Fifty (50) feet North-easterly from the centre line of the said Railway as said centre line is shown on said Plan No. BV 4667, and which lies to the Northwest of a line drawn at right angles through a point in said centre line distant Southeasterly thereon One Thousand, Six Hundred and Forty (1640) feet from the West boundary of said quarter section, containing Five and Eighty Five One Hundredths (5.85) acres, more or less,

Minerals in the Crown,

The significance of the site is as follows:

- a. Constructed in 1928 the McCord Museum is one of the oldest buildings in the Rural Municipality.
  - b. The Museum served as the Railway Station from 1928 to 1970 and presently houses CPR artifacts as well as hundreds of artifacts dating back to the days of our Pioneers.
  - c. The building is a landmark in the community.
2. The Rural Administrator is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this bylaw to be registered against the property described above in the proper land titles office.
  3. The Rural Administrator is hereby authorized to cause a copy of this bylaw to be served on the owner of the aforesaid property and on the Minister and to cause notice of the passing of this bylaw.
  4. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect on the day of the final passing thereof.
