BYLAW NO. 02/95

A BYLAW TO ESTABLISH AND CONTROL PROSPECT CEMETERY

The council of the Rural Municipality of Mankota No. 45 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

The management and control of the Prospect Cemetery within the municipality shall be vested in the council, or a committee of the council, which shall allot burial lots therein and issue licences therefore, and may make regulations governing the same, not inconsistent with the bylaw.

The following sums shall be charged for licences and shall be paid by applicants at the time of selection:

The licensee of the lot may, subject to the approval of the council, erect proper stones or monuments and cultivate trees, shrubs, and plants thereon but no such tree or shrub shall be cut down or destroyed without the consent of council.

If any tree or shrub, by means of its roots, branches or otherwise, becomes detrimental to an adjacent lot or avenue or dangerous or inconvenient, the council may direct the removal of such tree or shrub or parts thereof.

The council may remove any monument, enclosure or any inscription placed in or upon any lot which it deems to be improper or injurious to the appearance of the cemetery.

The council may from time to time make such rules and regulations for the government of the grounds as it deems necessary and proper to secure and promote the general objects of the cemetery.

The licensees of lots and their families shall be allowed access to the grounds at all reasonable times and may improve their lots at any time.

The interment of the poor and of persons unable to pay the necessary expenses shall be in such portions of the grounds as may be designated from time to time by council, which may in its discretion furnish free graves for such persons.

All funds and fees received from the licence of burial lots shall be applied solely to purchasing, laying out, fencing, ornamenting and keeping in repair the cemetery and roads and accesses thereto, and in defraying all necessary expenses.

The council may employ such surveyors, gardeners and caretakers as it deems necessary and may pay them such remuneration as it deems proper.

The caretaker shall have supervision over the whole cemetery subject to the direction of council.

Any person who willfully destroys, mutilates, defaces, injures or removes any tomb, monument, gravestone, or any structure, railing or other work for the protection of ornamentation of the cemetery of any burial lot, or who willfully destroys, cuts, breaks or injures any tree, shrub or plant or flowers, or plays any game or sport, discharges firearms except at a military funeral or willfully or unlawfully disturbs the peace and good order of the cemetery, or who commits a nuisance or behaves in an indecent or unseemly manner shall be liable to the penalties provided for and infraction of this bylaw.


The caretaker of the cemetery shall be in attendance at every interment.

In order that an accurate register of burials may be kept a statement shall be handed to the caretaker at the time of burial setting forth the burial lot, number, the name, place of nativity residence (with the legal description of the land occupied, age of the deceased person, married or single) and giving such other information as may be prescribed from time to time.

When possible at least one day's notice of an intended burial shall be given to the caretaker. Such notices shall state the size of the coffin or the measurements of the case, and location of the grave.

No graves shall be opened and no disinterment shall take place unless a written permit is obtained from the Deputy Minister of Public Health.

Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw, shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the general penalty bylaw of the municipality.
